Project EMPOWER collaborates with the Christine W. Avery Learning Center to Enhance Collaborative Services for Youth & Teens!

The Project EMPOWER program partnered with the Christine W. Avery Learning Center's STARS program and Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church of Asheville, Inc. during the month of June 2017 to implement the "Making Proud Choices" curriculum; thirty youth and teens were served. It's focus: to educate youth and teens about teen pregnancy, STIs/STDs and HIV/AIDS — echoing the fact that abstinence is the most effective way to eliminate these risks.

It would be beneficial if ALL youth and teens were educated about the fact that abstinence is the most effective way to prevent teen pregnancies, HIV/AIDS and STIs!

STARS: Setting Teens Around Roads to Success

STARS serves teens in grades 6-10. Making Proud Choices! 5th edition is an 8-module curriculum that provides adolescents with the knowledge, confidence and skills necessary to reduce their risk of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), HIV and pregnancy by abstaining from sex. Mount Zion Community Development, Inc.'s Project EMPOWER Program is abstinence-based, not abstinence only.

Making Proud Choices! is an adaptation and extension of the original Be Proud! Be Responsible! curriculum that integrates teen pregnancy prevention along with HIV/STD prevention. However, realizing the fact that abstinence is not the path that many young people choose, the curriculum spends a great deal of time encouraging the practice of safer sex — based on the fact that:

- In 2015, 8,807 youth were diagnosed with HIV in the United States
- Eighty percent (7,084) of those diagnoses occurred in persons aged 20 to 24
